Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for your continued support in our first week back. We have enjoyed welcoming everyone back to the school site, re-establishing our class teams and hearing the school full of laughter and joy. We have been really impressed with how quickly the children have settled and are grateful for your support and diligence in implementing the measures agreed in our risk assessment.

We recognise that there are some nuances that make things a bit tricky but trust that you understand why these systems are in place, as we look forward to a time when things become safer and our measures can be adapted accordingly.

Home work

We will not be setting any formal home learning tasks during Term 4 to allow children time to adjust to the routines and structures of being back with their class. Please use some time at home to support your child with their reading, spelling/phonics and times tables as these underpin a huge amount of what we are working on in school and are the quickest way to help your child feel more confident in their learning across the curriculum.

Reading - colour band books, free-readers and phonics-matched reading books and Bug Club. We ask children to read with an adult at least three times per week and for you to write a comment in their reading record.

Spellings/Phonics - overview or sounds to be learnt will be set by your child's class teacher.

Times Tables - Numberbots and/or Times Tables Rock Stars.

If you need log-in details for any of these, please contact your child's teacher via the year group email addresses.
