School Adaptions for September '21

Having consulted with parents, staff and the governing body we have agreed the following:

- The school will continue to have additional cleaning in the school day in Term 1 this will be reviewed as we monitor the infection rate and could continue beyond this.
- PE kit will continue to be worn on PE days.
- Parents meetings will be hosted online using Teams and supplemented with opportunities to visit the school site to see books and learning outcomes.
- Assemblies will remain online with a phased return to using the school hall as a whole school.
- Peripatetic music lessons will continue to be delivered remotely outside of the school day maximising school curriculum opportunities.
- The school day has been adjusted to allow for a slightly staggered drop off and pick up:

EYFS and KS1 – 8.45- 3.15 KS2 – 8.40-3.20

Everything else will return to normal, with no bubbles, one way systems or face coverings. We will return to a full curriculum with trips and visitors and a continued emphasis on supporting our children academically and pastorally as we move forward with the government road map.

From September the school will be working with a new sports provider to deliver PE lessons in KS2, after school sports clubs and holiday cover. We would like to thank Future Stars for all of the hard work and support for the school, with particular thanks to Matt Carpenter. Gym Clubs, who many of you will know, will be providing coaching and after school sports clubs.
