Anti-Bullying Week 15th – 19th of November

This week I worked with and trained our 10 new anti-bullying ambassadors to plan this really important annual event.

On Monday the 15th of November we will celebrate diversity wearing school uniform but Odd Socks - you can be as creative and colourful as you like.

On Friday the 19th it is also Children in Need and children are invited to make an online donation and come to school in their pyjamas. It is cold so please be mindful of this when selecting your outfit and consider how you can layer up for the weather.

During the week we will also share online assemblies, our updated anti-bullying charter and school policy.

My thanks to our wonderful ambassadors who will work with school staff to plan events throughout the year that embed our anti-bullying culture and promote kindness, respect and inclusivity.

School COVID-19 Risk Assessment

The Lighthouse Schools Partnership Trust has issued and updated our trust wide risk assessment template which we have personalised. You can find this on the policies page of our website.

Please note the much more robust approach to face coverings on the school site that acknowledges it is not possible to socially distance at pick up and drop off. It is now a requirement for all visitors to the site to wear a face covering unless exempt.

The Lighthouse Schools Partnership are taking this approach at all schools in the Trust.

"In cases of non-compliance the member of SLT on duty will remind those not wearing masks of the requirement to do so. In the case of continued non-compliance this will be followed up by a letter reiterating our approach.

Further non-compliance will lead to the headteacher sending a Final Warning Letter. As a last resort the headteacher and in the case of further non-cooperation, in consultation with the MAT/LA, will consider the potential of approaching DS and activating the 'Landlord Right' to warn the parent/carer and then, if necessary, proportionately ban them from the school site, backed by potential criminal sanction under section 547 of the Education Act 1996."

We thank you in advance for your cooperation and trust that you will work with us so that we are not in the awkward situation of having those difficult conversations.

Self-Isolation

When to self-isolate:

Self-isolate straight away and get a PCR test (a test that is sent to the lab) on GOV.UK as soon as possible if you have any of these 3 symptoms of COVID-19, even if they are mild:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste

You should also self-isolate straight away if:

- you've tested positive for COVID-19 this means you have the virus
- someone you live with has symptoms or tested positive (unless you are not required to self-isolate

 check below if this applies to you)
- you've been told to self-isolate following contact with someone who tested positive find out what to do if you're told to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace or the NHS COVID-19 app
- You may need to quarantine when you arrive in England from abroad. Check the quarantine rules when entering England on GOV.UK

When Not to self- Isolate:

If someone you live with has symptoms of COVID-19, or has tested positive for COVID-19, you will not need to self-isolate if any of the following apply:

- you're fully vaccinated this means 14 days have passed since your final dose of a COVID-19 vaccine given by the NHS
- you're under 18 years, 6 months old
- you're taking part or have taken part in a COVID-19 vaccine trial
- you're not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

Even if you do not have symptoms, you should still:

- get a PCR test on GOV.UK to check if you have COVID-19
- follow advice on how to avoid catching and spreading COVID-19
- consider limiting contact with people who are at higher risk from COVID-19
