It continues to be a very busy but exciting time at Portishead Primary School though not without some continued challenges for us all.

Curriculum and Learning News

Mathematics: Senior Leaders and our LSP Trust advisor visited maths lessons across the school to assess the impact of our Mastery Maths approach and maths curriculum. A governor came to the feedback session, they will feed back to the governing body. The Trust advisor also writes a note of visit for school leaders and the governing body. It was a fantastic morning and we witnessed some fabulous teaching and learning that reflects the strong evidence of progress we have seen when we have looked at books and spoken to children earlier in the year.

Behaviour: A governor visited the school to review our lunchtime provision for pupils and see for themselves the high standard of behaviour that we see every day. Visits like this allow the governors to challenge and support senior leaders and independently evidence the quality of our offer and impact of school actions. This was a follow up visit to one earlier in the year that looked at behaviour in general and how our behaviour and anti-bullying policies impact on day to day school provision.

PSHE: Governors also came in and met with our PSHE and Science leads to review how we deliver our PHSE and Relationships and Sex Education. These curriculum areas have become increasingly important in supporting pupils after the last 2 years.

Parking

Please can we ask all car drivers to park responsibly and considerately when visiting the school site. We have had a number of evidenced concerns shared with us where parking has been both dangerous and very inconsiderate. We pass on concerns to Avon and Somerset Police and you should expect to see an increase in patrols of the area. We understand the time pressure you are under and are extremely grateful that the overwhelming majority of you do the right thing because it is the right thing – great personal integrity and modelling of appropriate behaviour and values to your children.
