Parent Survey Results and School Improvement

We were very grateful for the responses you gave us in the annual parent survey. Our Trust and governors review the analysis of this data and it is worth sharing that your responses compared well with other trust schools. We use this feedback alongside staff feedback, analysis of school performance data, school improvement visits and our own assessment evaluation of teaching, book looks and pupil conferencing to prepare our school improvement plan. This will be published online after our governing body meeting next week. Our key school priorities include: SEND provision, curriculum development, the review of our behaviour systems, reconnecting the school community and improving communication with parents about learning and the progress of their children.
